Catechism of the Catholic Church (CCC nos 2032-37)



"I have now brought you the first fruits of the products of the soil which you, O Lord, have given to me." - Deuteronomy 26:10

This line from the Old Testament offers two challenges. First, do you give to God from your "first fruits" - the first and best that you have to offer? Or do you give from what you have leftover? Second, do you realize that everything you have and that everything you are has been given to you by God? We aren't owners of anything, we are merely stewards of God's gifts. Pray for a grateful and generous heart, every day, in all circumstances.

Dear Friends:

T'S HARD TO BELIEVE THAT WE HAVE ALREADY OBSERVED ASH WEDNESDAY AND ARE NOW IN THE SEASON OF LENT. While there are surely many resources from which to find guidance in these 40 days, the Sacred Scriptures is primary among them.

We know only too well that God's Word oftentimes gives pointed and clear advice as to not only what we shouldn't do, but more importantly, what we should do as followers of Christ. Of course, a careful reading of the Scriptures can give even the best person among us reasons to pause and look again (and again) at our life.

This weekend, we hear from Luke's Gospel the passage describing the temptation of Jesus. It always reminds me of the reality that Jesus too was tempted by the devil (as we all probably are as well!)

Perhaps a good way to start Lent is with an honest assessment of our temptations.

What are they? Do they involve money, sex, power, dishonesty, revenge, what? How do they manifest themselves? How can we better resist them?

After acknowledging our temptations, we are called to try to resist and overcome them. Undoubtedly, resisting temptation is much easier said than done, but with God's grace, we surely can successfully resist and overcome them. A useful resource on temptation is accessible below. In short, among the ten thoughts, the author uses the Scriptures and notes that temptation can be overcome by observing the following:

- 1. Understanding the source of temptation;
- Depending on God's strength;
- 3. Use the Word of God as a weapon;
- 4. Flee from sinful desires;
- 5. Cultivate a culture of prayer;
- 6. Embrace the Holy Spirit's guidance.

VERCOMING TEMPTATION IS A CHALLENGING, but essential part of the Christian life. This Lent, let's all try our best at it. And of course, the sacrament of Confession is available every Friday night at 6:00 pm and Saturday morning at 8:30 am to be forgiven of the times we failed and sinned.

Let's continue to pray for one another this Lent.




